



Evidencing the impact of Primary PE and Sport Premium Funding

Cookham Rise Primary School 2021/22

In 2021/22 Cookham Rise received funding of £17,790. Of this, £2,843 was spent purchasing the Ascot and Maidenhead School Sports Partnership (A&MSSP) Active package which provides access to local inter-school competitions, some CPD opportunities for staff and 12 hours of specialist coaching and advisory support.

As Covid restrictions eased, we began to reintroduce a variety of extra-curricula clubs (many of which are free and run by a combination of parent volunteers and staff) including running, netball, badminton and Kickboxing. KS2 children were also able to compete again with other schools in the A&MSSP including hockey, netball, football, cricket and the Invictus Festival which specifically targets children who would not normally represent the school in competitive sport.

We also participated in the Commonwealth Games Schools Baton Relay with two children chosen to run our leg who, we felt, represented the spirit of the games and had worked hard during the year to overcome their own personal challenges.

School Games

The application process was undertaken nationally for the School Games Mark Award for the first time since 2018/19. Criteria have changed considerably to focus on:

- Creating a positive experience for all children by ensuring that physical activity and competition provision is designed to reflect the motivation, competence and confidence of all young people
- To create positive experiences that promote the character development of targeted young people
- To advocate to key stakeholders how School Games makes a meaningful difference to the lives of children and to engage and educate parents

We were pleased to be achieve the Silver Award.
