



Evidencing the impact of Primary PE and Sport Premium: Cookham Rise Primary School 2020/21



In 2020/21 Cookham Rise received funding of £17,772 Of this, £2,812 was spent purchasing the Ascot and Maidenhead School Sports Partnership (A&MSSP) Active package which provides access to local inter-school competitions, some CPD opportunities for staff and 12 hours of specialist coaching and advisory support.

Prior to lockdown the children across the school were being offered a variety of extra curricula clubs (many of which are free and run by a combination of parent volunteers and staff) including hockey, running, netball, badminton, Street Dance and Kickboxing.

Following the closure of school to most children in January 2021, planned large scale events had to be cancelled. However, staff continued to promote the importance of exercise for children at home; encouraging participation in Joe Weeks PE sessions as well as suggesting other activities to try and ensure that children were active for at least an hour a day. Every child was provided with a skipping rope and encouraged to engage in skipping challenges and beat their personal best. Online dance sessions also were available to children to join in with at home.

On the return of all children in late March, a range of adapted sporting opportunities were provided including specialist coaching, participation in the Berkshire Virtual Games, *Dan the Skipping Man* challenges as well as Sports' Days. We also hired an outdoor climbing wall to engage the children – and some staff – in a challenging adventurous activity.

No application process was undertaken nationally for the School Games Mark Award. We retain the Gold Award achieved based on 2018/19 data.
