



## Evidencing the impact of Primary PE and Sport Premium: Cookham Rise Primary School



We are delighted to have retained the Gold Sports Mark in recognition of the ongoing achievements of staff, pupils and parents in promoting and encouraging all pupils in the school to lead healthy and active lives over the 2019/20 academic year. The benefits of a healthy and active lifestyle are promoted across the curriculum in PE, Life Skills and science lessons.

In 2019/20, Cookham Rise received funding of £17,772 Of this, £2,850 was spent purchasing the Ascot and Maidenhead School Sports Partnership (A&MSSP) Active package which provides access to local inter-school competitions, some CPD opportunities for staff and 12 hours of specialist coaching and advisory support.

Prior to lockdown the children across the school were being offered a variety of extra curricula clubs (many of which are free and run by a combination of parent volunteers and staff) and a range of competitive opportunities had been undertaken by children in KS2, including 'new' events such as Cross County.

Following the closure of school to most children on 20<sup>th</sup> March, planned large scale events had to be cancelled. However, staff continued to promote the importance of exercise for children at home; encouraging participation in Joe Weeks PE sessions as well as suggesting other activities to try and ensure that children were active for at least an hour a day.

For those children attending school during lockdown and those returning to school from 1<sup>st</sup> June, a range of adapted sporting opportunities were provided including specialist coaching, participation in Berkshire Virtual Games as well as smaller scale Sports' Days.
