



Evidencing the impact of Primary PE and Sport Premium: Cookham Rise Primary School



We are delighted to have been awarded the Gold Sports Mark in recognition of the ongoing achievements of staff, pupils and parents in promoting and encouraging all pupils in the school to lead healthy and active lives over the 2018/19 academic year. The benefits of a healthy and active lifestyle are promoted across the curriculum in PE, Life Skills and science lessons.

In 2018/19, Cookham Rise received funding of £17,790. Of this, £2,809 was spent purchasing the Ascot and Maidenhead School Sports Partnership (A&MSSP) Premium package which provides access to local inter-school competitions, CPD opportunities for staff and specialist coaching and advisory support.
