English

Geography

As geographers, we will learn about renewable and non-renewable sources of energy. We will find out about how energy is generated in different parts of the world and learn about the impact of energy creation on the environment.

History

As historians, we will continue to learn about our local area and find out what we can discover about Cookham from primary sources including the census.

Science

As scientists, we will learn about evolution and inheritance. We will find out about electricity and energy, making simple circuits using batteries and switches.

This term, Willow 6 will have the opportunity to take part in Safer Internet day activities and a VR workshop on Climate Change.

As artists, we will create our own colour installations and will explore 2d to 3d making.

As computer scientists, we will learn about AI and being the transition from using blockly programming languages (such as Scratch) to using text-based languages (such as Logo and Python).

As technologists, we will prepare a simple, healthy meal.

French

As linguists, we will be learning about holiday vocabulary and planning our French holidays.

Life skills

As citizens, we will think about our goals for the year ahead, being healthy and staying safe.
